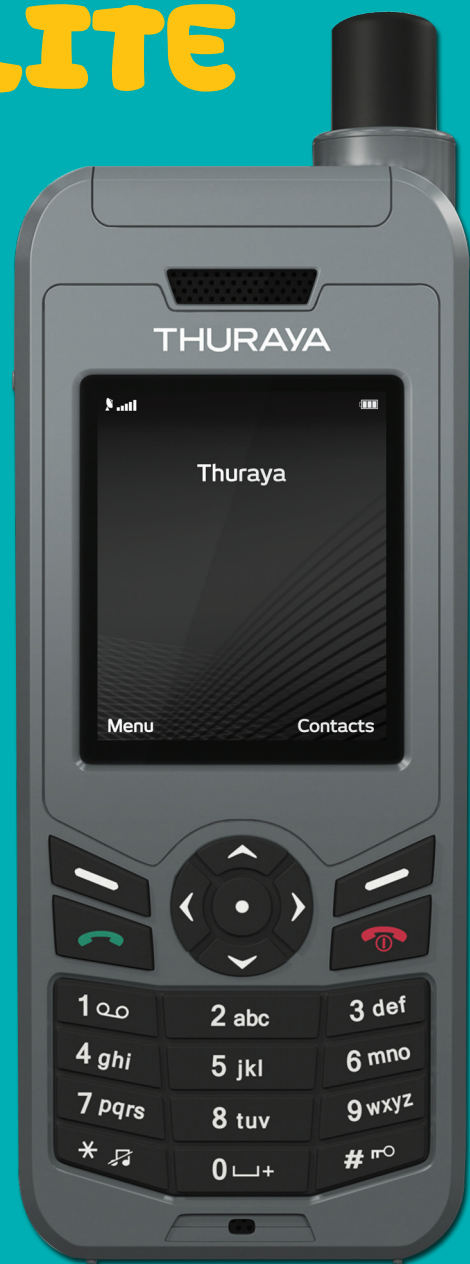

Want more info?

- The Thuraya Satellite Service is not guaranteed in any location even while in the Thuraya coverage area. This is because satellite calls require a clear line of sight to a Thuraya satellite, with no obstructions.
- The Thuraya XT-LITE requires its own SIM card and phone number.
- When in Satellite Mode, Emergency Dialling is not possible without an active Optus Thuraya SIM card in the handset. Emergency Dialling may not be possible while the keypad is locked, and may not operate in all locations or countries overseas (as per international roaming).
- Satellite calling requires the Australian area code for local landline numbers. For example, 02 for a NSW number.
- Sending and receiving SMS between other Australian carriers (eg. Telstra or Vodafone) and other satellite or international carriers (eg. Globalstar, Inmarsat or Iridium) is not guaranteed.
- Satellite to satellite calls cannot restrict CLI.
- The Thuraya XT-LITE does not support data, MMS, video calling, 1900 services, and premium SMS (PSMS).
